#### **Dwight Chasar**

Famous People and their Fowl Obsessions Wednesday, April 17, 2019 – 7 p.m., Happy Days Lodge

Dwight Chasar has been active in many aspects of ornithology in northeast Ohio for many years, leading bird walks, surveying bird populations and being an active participant in many bird-oriented organizations. In this presentation, Dwight looks at famous people—from political and sports figures to actors, music composers and Nobel Prize winners — among the 75 million people in North America who watch birds. He will talk about the impact that bird watching has had on their careers and their private lives. In addition, Dwight will relate some surprising and interesting facts about these famous bird watchers, and try to identify birds that these people favored in their hobby.

For those of us who see Lake Erie every day, the water and the sky create a mesmerizing, ever-changing tableau, but over time the lake begins to look predictable and we forget its importance in our lives. In *Lake Erie: on the Edge*, Linda Butler sees not only the beauty of natural habitats but also how industry, farming, shipping, railroads, human habitation, recreation, and natural areas all compete for space. Linda's photographs are unusual; they raise questions and help reawaken our curiosity and commitment to protect this jewel in our midst.

Linda has worked as an independent art photographer for more than 40 years, publishing four books and having more than 45 solo exhibitions in galleries and museums in the United States, Canada and Japan.
